Report from Councillor John Ward

Broadland District Council

The Pinebanks Development will be getting two entrances after all; Hillcrest Road and Henby Way after the Cabinet agreed to take ownership of the disputed land at Henby Way and quosh the restrictive covenants if there is no agreement between the parties by Nov 3rd.

The Council has seen an increase in the number of abandoned vehicles reported. Action will not be taken until a vehicle has been stationery for a minimum of 21 days. A vehicle's tax and MOT status can be checked at https://www.yehicleenquiry.service.gov.uk

Broadland has launched Top Dog where residents are asked to sign a pledge saying they will pick up after their pet and will report those who do not. A free dog ribbon and poo bags will be given to all those who sign up.

A pilot scheme for the kerbside collection of recyclable electricals in Reepham has been very successful and will be rolled out to other areas shortly.

Norfolk County Council

Norfolk has a new Chief Fire Officer following the appointment of Roy Harold to replace Nigel Williams who has retired. Mr Harold has 25 years fire and rescue service experience and has been Norfolk's Deputy Chief Fire Officer since 2013. He will also take on the role of Assistant Director for Fire and Community Resilience which encompasses Trading Standards, Community Safety and Emergency Planning.

Norfolk's seven-year-olds have posted record results in reading with the County moving ahead of the national average for the first time. 91% of pupils achieved expected level two or above, up from 89% in 2014 and above the national average of 90%.

With regards to "Devolution", the press got it wrong when they stated there is to be a combined or merged Suffolk & Norfolk County Council. This is not the case; the two Councils are seeking new/additional decision making power and resources from Central Government which would be exercised jointly by the two Councils.

Sprowston Sparhawk - playing field adjacent to school

You will be aware that the lease is due to terminate in December 2015.

I would like to formally request on behalf of the school that the land be returned before this date.

In discussion with Kevin Brown from NPS I understand that the rent is paid in two instalments during the year and the next payment is expected on 8 October. We propose that the invoice for this is cancelled and no further payment be collected. If this can be agreed at the next meeting of the Town Council this month no further rent will be required.

I attach a map with the proposed boundary line against the remaining land for the Town Council's use. The fence will from A to B but also from the existing school boundary to this line. It is the intention of the school to retain an access gate towards Peregrine Way to allow a managed pedestrian access for parents and children at the beginning and end of the school day.

I hope this meets with your approval and I await your decision.



FW: Annual Meeting for Town & Parish Councils

I am writing to invite you to the Annual Meeting for Town & Parish Councils which this year will be held on Thursday 12th November.

The theme of the evening is "Community Matters" and within this theme we will be focussing particularly on the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). CIL payments in respect of the second half of 2015, are about to be paid to towns and parishes with some considerable amounts due to be paid eg one parish will receive in excess of £100,000. And, as development continues in Broadland, other towns/parishes may well find that they too receive significant amounts.

Clearly this will bring great opportunities to develop infrastructure initiatives in your parish or town but it will also bring challenges. We believe that many parishes and towns will find advice and guidance valuable - even, on occasion, legal advice to avoid the possibility of any challenges that may arise.

So the evening will be a forum to address the above topics and an opportunity to ask questions or raise concerns. It should be stressed that, even if your parish has no development imminent, CIL money can also arise from planning applications. For example, one of our smallest rural parishes is expecting the possibility of an income stream from barn conversions.

To support parish and town councils' plans for infrastructure developments, Broadland's Cabinet has approved the launch of a fund - the Community Infrastructure Fund - which will provide towns/parishes with a borrowing facility (against future CIL payments) to bid for local infrastructure projects. More information about this fund will be provided on the night.

As always the formal part of the evening will commence at 7:30 with a buffet served from 6:30pm. Members of Broadland's Cabinet will be attending together with the Council's senior officers so there will be plenty of opportunities to ask questions and raise matters both formally and informally.

The size of the Council Chamber governs the size of the attendance so, in the first instance, I have to limit the numbers to 3 per parish/town. I look forward to hearing from you if you wish to attend and would appreciate responses by no later than Friday 6th November so I can arrange the catering.

In the meantime, should you wish to contact me about the event for any reason, do feel free to do so.

NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (SPROWSTON, VARIOUS ROADS) (20 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT AND SPEED LIMIT ZONE) ORDER 2015 NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL – SPROWSTON, VARIOUS ROADS – FOOTWAY CONVERSION TO CYCLETRACK/FOOTWAY AND PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLIST CROSSINGS

The Norfolk County Council proposes to make two Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, the effect of which will be to:-

- (i) prohibit any vehicle from exceeding 20 miles per hour along the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1 and 2 below;
- (ii) consolidate the remaining lengths of 30 mile per hour along the C256 Woodside Road into a new 30 m.p.h. speed limit order.

The following Order will become partially revoked in so far as it relates to Woodside Road, Sprowston on the date of commencement of this Order as follows:-

"THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (THORPE ST ANDREW AND SPROWSTON, WOODSIDE ROAD) (30 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2001"

The Norfolk County Council is also proposing to convert lengths of existing footway to combined cycleway/footway using powers under Section 66(4) and Section 65(1) of the Highways Act 1980 along the:-

- (i) 5F188 footpath from its junction with the U51140 Hammond Close between Property Numbers 23 and 38 Hammond Close to its junction with the C283 Salhouse Road.
- (ii) the southern footway of the C283 Salhouse Road from its junction with the 5F188 footpath north-eastwards for a distance of 20 metres.

The converted cycletrack/footpath and cycletrack/footway will have a width of 3 metres. Pedestrians and cyclists will have joint use and will not be segregated;

- (iii) the western footway of the C256 Woodside Road from a point 20 metres north of its junction with Lishman Road southwards to its junction with Lishman Road;
- (iv) the northern footway of Lishman Road from its junction with the C256 Woodside Road westwards for a distance of 13 metres.

The converted cycletrack/footpath and cycletrack/footway will have a width of 3.5 metres. Pedestrians and cyclists will have joint use and will not be segregated;

Any objection and representation relating to the above proposals must be made in writing and must specify the grounds on which they are made. All correspondence for these proposals must be received at the office of the Department of Legal Services, Norfolk County Council, County Hall, Martineau Lane, Norwich, NR1 2DH, marked for the attention of Mr Panchal by 30th October 2015. They may also be emailed to TrafficOrders@norfolk.gov.uk.

The Norfolk County Council also give Notice they intend to construct the following pedestrian and cycle crossings under s23 and s25 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act at the following locations:



- (v) A Zebra pedestrian crossing and associated Zebra controlled area and cycle crossing providing segregated crossing facilities for pedestrians and cyclists on the C256 Woodside Road at a point 15 metres north of its junction with Lishman Road:
- (vi) A Toucan Pedestrian and cyclist crossing and a Toucan controlled area along the C283 Salhouse Road at a point 120 metres north-east of its junction with the U57339 Hammond Way.

Distances measured are to the centre point of the pedestrian crossings.
