17/002. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Written apologies for absence were received and accepted by the Council from Mr J H Mallen and verbal apologies from Mr R J Knowles, Mr T Landamore and Mr C L Noble and Mrs J Poynter.

17/003. MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council meeting held on 7 and 14 December 2016, having previously been circulated to all Members were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

17/004. PRECEPT CONSULTATION

Referring to Minute 16/247 4.1, the Town Clerk reported that the National Association of Local Councils had confirmed that council tax referendum principles had not been extended to parish and town councils in 2017/18. The Secretary of State for communities announced the provisional local government finance settlement for 2017/18 in the House of Commons, and in his speech he stated "we have decided that we will defer our proposals this year, while keeping the level of precepts set by town and parish councils under close review. He expects all town and parish councils to clearly demonstrate restraint when setting increases that are not as a direct result of taking on additional responsibilities and is actively considering with the sector ways to make excessive increases more transparent to local taxpayers." The work of town and parish councils was recognised in his speech.

17/005. PERSONNEL

Further to Minute 16/225, it was **RESOLVED** to authorise the Town Clerk to appoint Mr Robert Meads to the post of Caretaker/Cleaner 37 hours commencing 10 January 2017 on spinal column point 16.

17/006. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

A written report was received from Mr J M Ward.

Mr Ward also verbally reported that:

- (1) members of Broadland District Council's planning meeting voted 8 to 7 to approve an outline application for 803 houses at Salhouse Road, next to John Fairclough Motors. This will include a primary school.
- (2) Matt Dunkley OBE, former Director of Children's Services in East Sussex, had been appointed as the new interim Director for Children's Services in Norfolk and was due to start in February 2017.
- (3) The next phase of the £10.3m Norwich flood alleviation scheme was now underway in Thorpe St. Andrew. This 10 month phase of the project follows work already completed in Taverham, Drayton and Sprowston. 7km of pipe will be laid in TSA on 27 roads. The overall project has been made possible through a 9.1m grant from the Department of Transport and an additional £1.2m from Norfolk County Council.

Mrs J Leggett verbally reported that the next meeting of the Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel would be held on Monday 31 January 2017, Gage Road Chapel, Gage Road, Sprowston commencing 7.00pm.

Mr N Shaw verbally reported on his attendance at the Strategic Aviation Special Interest Group Chairman's Advisory Group Meeting and advised that he would shortly be attending further meetings with SASIG and would report back to Council.

Report from Councillor John Ward

Broadland District Council

Apprenticeships Broadland have announced that to support the continued professional development and qualification progression they are now offering Business Administration Level 4 qualification. Details at apprenticeships@broadland.gov.uk

Work on the Greater Norwich Local Plan continues. The Call for Sites resulted in a large number of sites being submitted but they would not all be found suitable for development.

The Public Health Strategy for Norfolk 2016-20 was committed to working with district councils to address the wider determinants of health focussing on the following five priorities for which a grant of £17k pa will be available;-Housing, Planning and the Environment Leisure and Green Spaces

Community Safety

Protection and Environmental Health

Economic Development

Norfolk County Council

Following last July's vote by the Council to accept 50 vulnerable Syrian refugees to the county, the first 5 families, all with young children, will arrive in February. Extensive preparatory work has been carried out with district councils, health authorities, schools and voluntary groups. £40,000 has been raised by the CofE Norwich Diocese, Avenue Road Junior School raised over £1000 at a carol concert and Sanctuary Norfolk has received over 250 offers of furniture.

During Feb/Mar 2017, Sprowston Library will be converted to an 'Open Library' with extended opening hours. Library members can sign up to become Open Library users and will then have access to the library during the extended opening hours when it will be unmanned. There will be no reduction in staff hours.

Norfolk County Council will receive an additional £5.1m from Central Government to spend on road and transport improvements in the 2017/18 financial year. This is new funding to support local economic growth.

Report of the Town Clerk

COMMUNITY BUILDINGS, ALLOTMENTS, PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

1.1 Sprowston Diamond Centre – Front Car Park Markings

Attached, is a map showing the proposed front car park markings as designed by Bidwells. This drawing has been used to obtain quotations from the following, for thermo plastic lining:

J.S.Asphalt Bayline UK A.Waterfield & Sons Ltd RoadArt Roadmarkings

The quotations have been compared and a recommendation from Bidwells will be available at the meeting.

Recommendation: to instruct the approved contractor subject to consideration of the received quotations.

1.2 Edwards Road Car Park Surface and Lining

Eurovia Infrastructure Limited working under contract of Norfolk County Council has finished using Edwards Road Car Park as part of the Sprowston drainage project. The gentlemen's agreement for use of this area was that the car park would be repaired of any damage, swept and thermo plastic white lined, to the existing layout, to a cost to Norfolk County Council in the region of approximately £1,500.00.

The car park has been patch repaired where damage occurred and swept; however, the surface is poor and Members will recall that this area has been identified as in need of an improved surface and bay lines. It is felt at this time that marking out this car park would not be of benefit with the current surface and Eurovia have submitted for consideration the attached quotation from their supply chain partner, MW Surfacing, to carry out surfacing and associated works in the car park at Sprowston Recreation Ground. Included in this quotation is kerbing works to the entrance way and western perimeter of the car park as the existing edgings face would be lost if a 40mm overlay was carried out. If this is not required it could be removed from the quotation.

Norfolk County Council has offered to produce the layout of the car park, to an agreed drawing, carried out free of charge.

A previous quotation supplied in 2014, which would be subject to a three year increase, of a similar specification had been received by this Council at £35,240.00 +VAT.

If Members decide to continue with the resurfacing of this car park our Head Groundsman would suggest that the small trees are removed from the centre of the car park to make this easier and more area for parking. The trees were planted a long time ago and have not grown to their expectations and remain quite small.

Recommendation: to consider the quotation from MW Surfacing.

STREET LIGHTING

3.1 Lighting Authority

For Members information, Broadland Council is the lighting Authority in five parishes across their district. It is responsible for the maintenance and energy costs of footway lighting which are recovered through a special expense charged through the Council Tax of the residents living in those parishes. Sprowston is not included.

For the last ten years Norfolk County Council has adopted and managed all footway lighting across the district through a Private Finance Initiative (PFI) Contract. However, in September 2015 the County Council agreed a number of budget savings, one of which was that they would no longer require or adopt footway lighting on new developments. In light of the County Council decision, Broadland Council needs to review its approach and decide whether it would require footway lighting on new developments in the parishes for which this Council is the Lighting Authority.

Broadland Council, in view of the County Council decision, have requested confirmation of this Council to take on responsibility for footway lighting on new developments in the Sprowston area. For information, the Broadland Council Environmental Excellence Panel has recommended to Cabinet that they should take on the management and maintenance of new footway lighting in any area where the Town or Parish Council is not willing or able to, and recharge the cost as a special expense charged through the Council Tax of all residents living in those parishes. In addition, that Panel has also recommended that any new and replacement footway lighting managed by Broadland should be operated so as to provide part night or dimmed lighting.

Recommendation: for Sprowston Town Council to continue to adopt footway lighting on any new developments in their area.

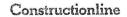

Dear Parish and Town Council Clerks,

As you may know, Broadland Council is the lighting Authority in five parishes across the District. It is responsible for the maintenance and energy costs of footway lighting which are recovered through a special expense charged through the Council Tax of the residents living in those parishes.

For the last ten years Norfolk County Council has adopted and managed all footway lighting across the district through a Private Finance Initiative (PFI) Contract. However, in September 2015 the County Council agreed a number of budget savings, one of which was that they would no longer require or adopt footway lighting on new developments.

In light of the County Council decision, Broadland Council needs to review its approach and decide whether it would require footway lighting on new developments in the parishes for which this Council is the Lighting Authority.

The reason for this note to all Town and Parish Councils is to find out whether, in view of the County Council decision, they would take on responsibility for footway lighting on new developments in their area. For your information, The Broadland Council Environmental Excellence Panel has recommended to Cabinet that this Council should take on the management and maintenance of new footway lighting in any area where the Town or Parish Council is not willing or able to, and recharge the cost as a special expense charged through the Council Tax of all residents living in those parishes. In addition, the Environmental Excellence Panel has also recommended that any new and replacement footway lighting managed by this Council should be operated so as to provide part night or dimmed lighting.

I would be most grateful for your response to this issue by 13 February 2017.
