YAB Annual Project 2017

The results of the YAB's annual survey showed that priorities for young people in Broadland were bullying and cyber-bullying, positive friendships, and confidence and self-esteem. From this, the YAB has designed a project which will work with a range of young people in the district to tackle problems in these areas. The YAB is currently in the process of appointing a local youth organisation who will run this scheme on their behalf. The chosen organisation will be announced soon.

The Annual Town and Parish Council Meeting and the YAB Youth Engagement Project

Ollie Simons, the YAB Youth Engagement worker, spoke at Broadland District Council's Annual Town and Parish Meeting which invited parish and town councillors and clerks to share their thoughts and experiences.

Ollie promoted the ongoing youth engagement project which supports and facilitates young people's engagement with their town or parish council. The event was attended by over 40 people and led to fitted discussion between the YAB and town and parish councillors.

The main aim of the youth engagement project is to host assemblies and workshops in Broadland schools where parish councillors can speak with young people about what the council's role is, what it does and how it operates. Young people's lack of understanding of the role of their local council is one of the main hurdles which parish and town councils face and it is hoped that the school sessions will help to combat this.

Sprowston Youth Engagement Project's Celebration Event

Over the past two years, the Broadland YAB has supported the Sprowston Youth Engagement Project (SYEP) to deliver a youth café in Sprowston. The project has been very successful with more than forty young people visiting the youth café regularly. To mark the success of the project, the SYEP held a celebration event at B2B in Sprowston. The evening included performances from the young people and videos created by the young people which showed the great work which the SYEP has carried out. It was a pleasure for the YAB to attend the event and to speak to the young people about their experiences.

Acle Youth Club

The Acle Youth Club was relaunched in September 2016 with the support of YMCA Norfolk and Acle Parish Council. Since then, the new club has been very successful with between 15 and 20 local young people attending each week. The parish council has now secured more staff so the club can run into the foreseeable future.
