## 17/051. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

## 17/052. MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council meeting held on 22 February 2017, having previously been circulated to all Members were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

## 17/053. POLICE LIASON OFFICER'S REPORT

Members noted the crime updates from 1 - 28 February 2017 but felt unable to comment as it was difficult to differentiate between Old Catton and Sprowston.

Mrs J Leggett advised that she had written to the Police Commissioner expressing her displeasure.

# 17/054. PHASE 4 SPROWSTON DIAMOND CENTRE

Jason Menezes of Bidwells, the Council's architect and Ben Lyng of Ingleton Wood LLP, Associate Building Services Engineer gave a detailed presentation on the Phase 4 development of Sprowston Diamond Centre and answered Members questions therefrom.

## 17/056. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

A written report was received from Mr J M Ward.

Mr Ward also verbally reported:

(1) that at Thorpe Lodge at 10.00am on Monday 13 March 2017 he had raised the flag for Commonwealth Day reading an affirmation from the Commonwealth Secretary General and a message from the Queen.

The Commonwealth has some 2.5 billion people, a third of the world's population in its 52 member states. This year's theme is "A peace building Commonwealth" and flying the flag is an occasion to acknowledge publicly and collectively the continuing aspiration of the Commonwealth to build on common traditions and uphold our shared values of democracy, inclusion, development and respect for diversity.

(2) that at Broadland District Council's Communities Committee on 8 March 2017 one of the agenda items was Trading Standards where members heard of their work in ensuring the quality and safety of the food chain, including animal food and fertilisers, safeguarding the standards of animal health and welfare, tackling the supply of alcohol, tobacco etc. to underage young people, ensuring the safety of consumer products and tackling rogue traders and scams.

Mrs J Leggett verbally reported that:

- (1) at the Environment Development and Transport Committee meeting there was a paper to bring forward the idea for Councillors to be given a budget of £6,000 to spend in the area they represent.
- (2) there was to be an independent enquiry into 16 18 years olds living in unregulated accommodation.

Mrs B J Lashley commented that she could understand how an individual budget could work for a Councillor who represented a small area but questioned how this would work for a Councillor representing several parishes.

Mrs J Leggett responded that every effort would be made to ensure fair distribution.

## 17/057. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS (CONTINUED)

Mrs B J Lashley asked District Councillor's what additional services the District intended to provide given their increase in Council Tax.

Mr J M Ward replied that the increase was to maintain services and to purchase two properties to house homeless families.

## 17/058. RESIDENT'S QUESTIONS

On the motion of Mrs J Leggett, seconded by Mr K Lashley it was **RESOLVED** that the meeting be adjourned to receive residents' questions on matters concerning the town. Residents were reminded that their questions should be addressed to the Chairman who would, assisted by the Town Clerk, reply.

Mrs Tipple of Wroxham Road reported that she was representing the views of over 200 people who had voted on facebook regarding the state of the verges in Sprowston, commenting that she felt that the Town Council should take some responsibility to improve them.

Claire Lincoln, Lead Youth Worker Sprowston Youth Engagement Project (SYEP) asked the Council to support a funding application for £2,500. She gave a presentation on the group's activities, projects and successes and read a statement from one of the committee members.

Presentations were also received from Sam on his experience as an attendee at SYEP and Cath Evans, the longest running volunteer, who said she felt that young people had benefitted in many ways from this project including improved confidence, and that numbers were increasing with regularly over 40 attendees.

Reverend Canon Simon Stokes underlined what had been said stating that the model created had been seen as good practice across the county. He urged the Council to support SYEP commenting that they were trying to fund this in partnership with the Town Council and other groups in Sprowston.

## 17/059. FULL COUNCIL MEETINGS

Mr I Moncur proposed, seconded by Mr R J Knowles to commence Full Council Meetings at 7.00pm and on being to the vote the motion was **LOST**.

### 17/060. PROVISION OF TREE IN HIGHWAY

Mr J M Ward reported that he had been approached by a resident of 43, Tiercel Avenue regarding the replacement of a tree in the verge outside her property which was diseased and had blown down in the wind a while ago.

Norfolk County Council would like it replaced but does not have the funding however would have no objection to the Town Council purchasing and planting a replacement tree.

Mr J M Ward proposed, seconded Mr I Moncur to replace the tree outside 43, Tiercel Avenue.

Mrs B J Lashley felt it would set a precedent; it was not the right time of year for bare root planting and would require a pot contained tree which would have to be maintained by town council staff. Furthermore if the tree was diseased and the root and stump remained it could be difficult to replant.

- (b) to raise no objection to planning application 2017/0171 part change of use from unit 7 from approved office use B1 to Children's Nursery D1 at White House Farm, Salhouse Road but express concern regarding access as a Nursery would increase traffic and currently the only access is via a narrow route from Blue Boar Lane.
- (c) to oppose the granting of planning application 2017/0240 erection of boundary fence retrospective at 95, Foxburrow Road on the grounds that at least four panels facing Cozens Hardy Road should be reduced to a height appropriate to a front garden.
- (d) to oppose the granting of planning application 2017/0279 proposed new dwelling at Land adj. 60, Russell Avenue on the grounds that it is an over development of the site and out of keeping with the street scene.

# Report from Councillor John Ward

## **Broadland District Council**

The Council sponsored Wellbeing Fair was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> March at Roxley Hall. It was a popular event especially the free Slow Cooker Workshop.

On that same day I attended Sprowston Community High School to present Broadland's Sporting Award cheques of £1000 each to Tiegan Poynter for baton twirling and Serena Grace for athletics. Both these local girls are competing nationally and internationally.

# **Norfolk County Council**

On 17<sup>th</sup> March I was present at an event at County Hall to mark the 5<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the signing of the Armed Forces Covenant. The armed forces community in Norfolk numbers some 2850 and the County Council allocates £20k per year to support them with a number of projects.

Arts Council England has given the Library Service £98k to set up the Norfolk Reading Pathway which will help more than 750 residents learn to read. To deliver the scheme, the service will be recruiting 150 volunteers.

The library service is also running its Great Big Read 20<sup>th</sup> March to 22<sup>nd</sup> April. The theme is 'Norfolk's Most Wanted' and features a list of 20 of the most popular books asked for by library customers.

Preparations are currently underway to convert Sprowston Library to 'Open Plus' which will give unmanned extended opening hours. This should be completed in April.

The Norfolk Youth Fund is now live for applicants. £20,000 is available and charitable organisations and community groups involving young people have the opportunity to apply for a grant of up to £2k. Details from <a href="mailto:ben.dunne@norfolkj.gov.uk">ben.dunne@norfolkj.gov.uk</a>

Norwich Castle's ambitious plans to restore the castle keep have received a major boost with the award of £500,000 from the Garfield Weston Foundation. This National Lottery supported, £13m project, is scheduled for completion in 2020.

# COMMUNITY BUILDINGS, ALLOTMENTS, PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

## 1.1 Wilks Farm Drive Open Space

A request has been received from one of the residents on behalf of the occupants of the houses 120-122 Wilks Farm Drive to place gravel boards at the bottom of the fence and overlaying feather edged slats above them attached to the newly replaced post and rail fence abutting the open space at Wilks Farm Drive.

The rail and post fence has been replaced by this Council (photographs attached) as high winds from the storm on 23 February caused the existing fence and residents attached panels to weak and need repair. The residents, who wish to protect their property against dog fouling outside their homes, would cover the cost themselves of the attachment to this Council's rail and post fence as identified above.

Recommendation: to advise the Town Clerk to act accordingly.

## 1.2 Sprowston Infant School Use of Recreation Ground

Norfolk County Council Estates Portfolio / Infrastructure Officer of Children's Services has informed this Council that as of 1 April 2017 Sprowston Infant School, who have historically paid this Council for use of the playing field, will no longer require the use of the field to deliver their curriculum.

Sprowston Junior School will continue with the current arrangement of use of the Recreation Ground. The combined invoice for both schools for 2016/17 was £1339.81 which was split equally by Norfolk County Council between both schools.

The 2017/18 budget includes a 3% increase on recreational hire and it is therefore suggested that Sprowston Junior School are charged this year £710.50.

Should the Infants School wish to arrange a sessional usage of the field for their summer sports day event then an approach will be made to this Council and charged. Currently, this Council has a daily rate for bowls, cricket and football but no charge for the recreation ground, so Members would need to consider the basis of any future hiring of the recreation ground by the school.

Recommendation: to advise the Town Clerk to act accordingly.
