A letter was circulated from Simon Bailey Chief Constable updating on the progress of their Norfolk 2020 proposals.

## 18/006. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

A written report was received from Mr J M Ward.

Mr Ward also verbally reported that:

(a) a new partnership has been launched to support Norfolk based voluntary organisations, community groups and social enterprises. It comprises Norfolk County Council, Community Action Norfolk, Voluntary Norfolk and Momentum to bring together a wealth of skills and experience in the voluntary sector.

# 18/006. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS (CONTINUED)

- (b) Nick Tupper, Assistant Director highways wishes to remind Councils that the parish partnership arrangement continues, where Norfolk County Council fund up to 50% of parish partnership bids (upper limit £25,000) to deliver small highway improvements
- (c) the Government has said that Councils can raise council tax by an additional 1% to a maximum of 5.9% (3% of this will go to adult social care). A 1% rise would increase the Councils budget by £4m easing pressure on out services. Full Council will make a decision on Council Tax on February 12 2018. A 5.99% rise would increase the County Council's share of Band D bills by £74.74 per year to £1,322.68.
- (d) rising athletic stars in Broadland can now apply for a Sports Community Grant to help with the cost of training or competing. Grants of up to £125 are available per athlete with a closing date of 29 January 2018. Details at <a href="https://www.broadland.gov.uk/sportsgrant">www.broadland.gov.uk/sportsgrant</a>
- (e) Jack Sadler, Broadland District Standards Committee has died.

Councillors expressed their sadness and reminisced on aspects of Mr Sadler's public life.

Referring to Mr Ward's written report Mr W F Couzens:

- (a) expressed his congratulations to Jill Penn on her achievements
- (b) asked if the Garden Waste Service's continued annual growth was due to the sale of the bins or the product.

Mr Ward advised that it was due to the sale of the product.

Mr Couzens asked if this annual growth would lead to a reduction in the cost of the bins.

Mr Ward advised that Broadland District Council were thinking of increasing the price of the bins.

Mr Couzens suggested that a reduction in the cost of the bins could increase the customer base and the larger bulk of saleable product would make the service more cost effective and better for the environment.

Mr I Moncur commented that it was customary for the outgoing Chairman to donate something to the Council and circulated an artist's impression of a weather vane he had commissioned to be erected on Sprowston Diamond Centre at the topping out ceremony in February. The Town Clerk would progress this.


# Message from Inspector Lisa Hooper

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Business and Community	1	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Burglary Residential	4	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and

Criminal Damage	7	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.

Broadland Police are recruiting a wide variety of volunteer roles. These include the Special Constabulary, Police Support Volunteers, Neighbourhood Watch and Community Speed Watch. # Report from Councillor John Ward

## **Broadland District Council**

The Greater Norwich Local Plan Consultation has commenced and runs until 15.3.18. The Draft Plan will be published Summer 2019 with submission October 2019 and adoption December 2020. There will be 25 road shows during the consultation period.

43,000 homes are to be built 2015-2036 with 36,665 already committed, leaving 7335 to be allocated.

There could be one or two new settlements of 2000 homes each at possible sites Wymondham/Hethel or Honingham Thorpe; or there could be smaller developments throughout the area. Details at <a href="https://www.gnlp.org.uk">www.gnlp.org.uk</a>

On Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> January Phil Courtier takes up his new role as Joint Head of Planning for Broadland and South Nortfolk District Councils.

Transport priorities for the next 20 years are the focus of a new survey that aims to find out what matters most to people as they drive around the city. The latest Ofsted report into Norfolk Children's Services grades the service "Requires Improvement" which is progress from the previous grading of "Inadequate". The Adoption Services were rated "Outstanding" Our new Head of Children's Services, Sarah Tough is aiming for an overall "Good" rating at the next inspection.

The Police and Crime Commissioner, Lorne Green has engaged consultants to carry out a review of the governance of the Fire & Rescue Service with a view to it eventually sitting under his control.

The Leader of the Council, Cliff Jordan has said there is no compelling case for any change and to proceed further with a full business case would be a waste of taxpayer's money. The Communities Committee has agreed with his view and it will now go to Full Council for a final decision.

## 1.1 Sparhawk Park Play Equipment

The Roc n' Cross at the larger play site at Sparhawk Park has failed the latest safety inspection. This see-saw does not move as it should and the internal mechanism has broken. The company who provided this equipment has ceased trading and parts cannot be sourced in this country having to be procured from the USA. Representatives from other companies who produce play equipment have also failed to give guidance or provide a solution other than to replace this piece of equipment.

Attached, for Members consideration are two quotations from Wicksteed Playscapes which could provide a piece of similar equipment to that in need of replacement at Sparhawk Park, being similar to the play value being lost by the Roc n' Cross.

**Recommendation:** to consider the quotations and instruct the Town Clerk with the chosen replacement play equipment.

## 1.2 Sprowston Diamond Centre

Arising from Minute 18/008 1.1 the Council named the rooms at Sprowston Diamond Centre after Head Teachers of the former premises. With the use of Beryl Read for the sports hall this now leaves one room to be named. I have researched the record and have found that Miss Jones was Headmistress in 1929.

**Recommendation:** to name the room Jones Room at Sprowston Diamond Centre.

## Greater Norwich Local Plan Regulation 18 Consultation 8/1/18 - 15/3/18

You are receiving this email as you have asked to be kept informed about the Greater Norwich Local Plan's (GNLP) progress. You may be aware that public consultation on the emerging (Regulation 18) GNLP will start on 8<sup>th</sup> January, running to 15<sup>th</sup> March 2018. We are seeking your views on a Growth Options document, which sets out:

- the broad housing numbers required to 2036;
- · six main distribution options; and
- a significant number of questions on various policy areas such as air quality, landscape and affordable housing

It is very important to note that this is an early consultation stage – no final decisions have been made on any policy choice. You can view the document online via <a href="www.gnlp.org.uk">www.gnlp.org.uk</a>, and make your comments at the same time. You don't need to answer every question – you can simply comment on whichever parts of the plan interest you.

The Site Proposals document is also published for consultation. It lists sites submitted to us for consideration for various uses through the plan, along with a settlement summary for those parishes where sites have been submitted. Again, no final decisions have been made on any site, and you can view the Site Proposals document and interactive maps online via <a href="www.gnlp.org.uk">www.gnlp.org.uk</a>, making your comments at the same time. You can comment on whichever sites interest you. The Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment (HELAA) in the evidence base has more detail on the sites submitted for potential inclusion in the GNLP. Other evidence studies, along with the Interim Sustainability Appraisal are also available online for comment.

About 25 roadshows at various locations in Greater Norwich have been planned to take place during the consultation period. The precise venues and dates are published on <a href="www.gnlp.org.uk">www.gnlp.org.uk</a>. Officers will be available at the roadshows to discuss policy options or sites in general terms, but it is stressed that this is an early stage consultation exercise, and no decisions will be made until later in the plan-making process. Parish councils have been invited to separate workshops.

Hard copies of the maps and all other consultation documents are available from the consultation deposit points:

- County Hall, Martineau Lane, Norwich (main reception);
- City Hall, St Peters Street, Norwich (2nd floor reception);
- Broadland District Council, Thorpe Road, Thorpe St Andrew (main reception);
