# Our proposal

Norfolk County Council would like to hear your views on our proposal for Sprowston Infant School, Recreation Ground Road, Norwich, Norfolk NR7 8EW to **add 8 places** to the complex needs Specialist Resource Base (SRB) from 1 February 2024.

We appreciate that children and young people with complex needs can struggle to engage with learning and cope in a classroom without additional strategies and interventions. A Resource Base can support children to overcome their barriers to learning, to be better able to cope and to be re-integrated into a mainstream setting, in which they can achieve their potential.

We are very keen to provide this support in Norfolk schools. Our Specialist Resource Base will be expanded to cope with the additional places and will still have an enabling environment for SRB learners in a bespoke accommodation base. The Base will be managed by the Headteacher and governing body at Sprowston Infant School.

The local authority, Norfolk County Council is responsible for all admissions to Specialist Resource Bases. Referrals are considered by a County panel, and placements of pupils with or without an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) are made using eligibility criteria for pupils with an ASC profile and assessing these against needs and appropriateness of referral.

# What are the benefits of this proposal

The main driver for Norfolk County Council and the governors at Sprowston Infant School, is to meet the increased demand for specialist educational provision within our area, to best meet the needs of our most vulnerable learners. We feel our proposal would benefit children and young people because it will:

- support more students with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance students' progress by effectively meeting their individual complex needs:
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support students to achieve their potential;

- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for students to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of students with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of complex need expertise and good practice as part of our school.

There are several considerations that Norfolk County Council take into account when considering changes to organisations of schools. These include school leadership, performance, impact on the community, diversity of provision, need for places, travel, early years provision and special education provision. The overall driving force is to ensure any change is in the best interest of children's education and achievement.

#### What will happen to children currently supported by the SRB

The current children supported by the SRB at Sprowston Infant School will remain on roll at the school and there will be no disruption to their learning. The only exceptions would be where an annual review of a child's Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) decided to consider a change of school, or parental preference changes.

#### **Capital costs**

The proposal is to expand the existing complex needs SRB to create a new 50sqm space. This will be achieved by extending the front of the school. The new space will include a new accessible pupil toilet and a corridor to the existing secure outdoor play area. In addition, there will be a new lobby to the main school entrance and two additional car parking spaces. Capital costs will be covered by Norfolk County Council.



Good evening Evelyn,

Introduce myself as of 183 Wroxham Rd, Norwich, NR7 8AG.

You opposed a grant of planning for our neighbours- Friends dental practice.

Firstly this extension came to light to me on tuesday, I had received no letter or notification of this so I was unaware of the ongoings around this case. But that is part another matter between myself and the Broadland Council.

I am wondering what we can do to work together to assist in contacting the highways regards current parking matters as currently, and for the last

3 years at least, parking has been a major hazard and potential incident zone for us, including several others residents along the road, these issues including dentist clients parking over dropped kerbs and driveways, I do not want to inundate you with pictures as you can probably imagine our regular frustration with inconsiderate parking, poor visibility to see past a stretch of dentist workers and clients vehicles. A few times now I have seen the passing traffic become clear to my right, as I begin to steadily emerge from my property a car appears because it has exited from Falcon Road West, a junction I cannot physically see as it becomes a blind spot to me with the vehicles parked along the roadside outside 179 & 181 Wroxham Road. Having children I worry so much about worst case dangers or situations that may occur that currently an undersized dentist car park and losing more spaces down the side of the property is going to become non existent will add to further chaos, let alone from contractors in the coming months to work on the property. On tuesday we had a neighbour group meeting to email the highways in attempting a site visit which 187 have asked for and been ignored and for a similar situation from little tescos to Blenheim Road has in having double yellow lines put in from little tescos to approximately 171 Wroxham Road opposite the junction from Falcon Road West to be considered at the highest level.

I have emailed your email to residents of 173 who will pass onto 171 & 175. 179 who will pass onto 177. of 187 has already made comments but will also get 189 to email yourself. so expect a few emails coming in.

This was your extract comment mentioned below about the application.

"Dear Planning Sprowston Town Council is opposed to the granting of planning application 20220724 on the grounds that a two storey extension would further reduce the available onsite parking at this dentist practice. The property is close to a shopping parade and pedestrian crossing. Any loss of onsite parking, would add substantially to existing highway problems (poor visibility and obstruction of the pavement) for both neighbouring properties, road users and pedestrians. Dear P.C. Gill,

I was given your contact details by Norfolk HQ as the local policeman for our area who could possible deal with or advise on the dangerous and inconsiderate parking of patients of Friend's Dental Practice, 185 Wroxham Road, NR7 8AG.

Since the expansion of the dental surgery over the past several years, I'm sure you must be aware of this problem as it has been reported and complained about by several residents and Sprowston Parish Council, we have now been made aware that the surgery is yet again going to be extended so we feel the problem will definitely worsen.

I have spoken to the dentist on several occasions over the years about the dangerous parking and they have intern put a notice in their front entrance door for their patients but of cause nobody takes any notice.

I have recently become an electric wheelchair user myself and find it very frightening having to ride into the carriageway to get past cars that have parked on the pavement blocking the path, we have also witnessed and helped several elderly residents of the Care Home a few hundred yards up the road to get past the vehicles.

The other equally DANGEROUS problem is entering and exiting our driveways for the local residents from 189 to 169 Wroxham Road with the patients vehicles blocking the view of the North and Southbound vehicles travelling along the road.

We, the local residents are in the process of contacting the various local authorities about the problems but we would very much appreciate a meeting with yourself to help and advise on the problems as far as the law is concerned.




