They describe themselves as a friendly club who enjoy the game, plaving to win but in the true spirit of cricket. Whilst playing hard, they also enjoy a bit of banter and a laugh.

Their senior sides are at levels 1 and 3 of the Norfolk Cricket leagues with three promotions between them in the last 3 seasons. The first team earned back-to-back championships in 2018 and 2019 earning a spot in the top tier of the Norfolk Cricket League.

Their new youth section is growing with a dedicated team ready to welcome any youngsters who would like get into cricket. All are very welcome.

Looking back at 2022 there was so much going on in Sprowston and the country too. There was the pageantry of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, followed by the sadness of her death three prime ministers, all in one year!

Many of the clubs and services closed due to Covid, opened their doors again. We began to feel normal again. Let's hope we continue to recover from that dreadful era.

There were several projects to improve Sprowston's ecology with well received community projects such as the rewilding of verges and planting hedges around the Diamond Field.

The Sprowston Youth Engagement Project (SYEP) completed and opened their new Urban Adventure Area on Church Lane. 2022 marked their 10th anniversary. Despite Covid the SYEP Team engaged with 548 young people, Blue Boar Lane. up from 340 the year before. The SYEP now meets every weekday evening either in Old Catton or Sprowston.

The Council will continue to look for projects to improve the ecology of the area including the planting of trees to commemorate those people of Sprowston who fell during the First World War, and more rewilding projects. The Town Council will continue to press to get the open spaces on the White House Farm development opened to the public in 2023. including the playing field behind White House Farm School and skate park opposite the Garden Centre on

Another major project for 2023 is the development of the former Viking pub/Royal Bengal restaurant on Tills Road into a Community Centre. We expect to start work on the site soon.

Last year's Sprowston Fete was a great success and the Council have agreed to hold another fete in the summer. We are looking forward to the coronation of King Charles on Saturday 6th May. Many of you, I know, will want to be involved in some way and we've decided to have a Coronation themed trail around Sprowston. In May there will be the local elections where you will have the chance to elect local residents to the Town and District Councils. This year there will be a major change. If you normally cast your vote at a polling station you will need to have valid photo ID. If you don't have a valid photo ID, or you are not sure, then get one as soon as you can. Your vote is important, please use it.

2023 Local Elections

District, town and parish elections are due to be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

This election will be the first time an official form of photographic identification (ID) will be required to be shown by all voters at a polling station. This has been introduced under the Elections Act 2022.

Acceptable forms of ID will include:

- a passport issued by the UK. any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- a driving licence issued by the UK. any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state
- a biometric immigration document an identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram
- (a PASS card) • Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- a Blue Badge
- a national identity card issued by an EEA state
- an Older Person's Bus Pass

If you do not have any of the accepted forms of ID you can apply online for a free Voter Authority Certificate - this is a photographic identity document specifically for the purpose of voting. If you own an accepted form of photographic ID but it has expired it can still

be used, as long as the photograph is still a good likeness of you. To access the application service for a Voter Authority Certificate please visit https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate You must be registered to vote in order to apply. If you need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, make sure you do so in good time ahead of it being required at the polling station. The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for local elections taking place on 4 May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April 2023.
